



## Emergency Coordination Meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2014

**Time: 3pm to 5 pm**

**Venue: CEET, Jammu**

### Agenda:

1. To take stock of current situation in Jammu Region
2. To decide next joint course of action and Joint Rapid Needs Assessment

### Situation Update and Key Discussions

- Rajouri, Poonch and Reasi are worst affected in the Jammu Region. Other affected districts are Jammu, Udhampur, Doda, Samba, Kathua and Kshtwar.
- Many villages in Reasi District are still not accessible and required immediate assessment and assistance.
- Immediate assistance is also required to large number of people coming from Shopian to Jammu on foot.
- In most of the areas, army is providing assistance to the affected people.
- As on 13-09-2014, total 1673 villages from 10 districts are affected. 5390 residential houses were fully damaged and 12125 are partially (excluding Poonch District) in Jammu Region.
- 83 relief camps are installed in the region and rehabilitated 22938 people.
- Many organizations have done the preliminary assessment in the areas and need to compile it at one place and Sphere India can do that.
- Still sufficient information is not available from the affected areas. Need was felt to strengthen the Multi stakeholder coordination and joint action plan.
- Few members has also suggested to established coordination center at regional level (at Srinagar and Jammu) and at state level. However it was discussed and agreed that the Sphere India will be compiling the information received from Jammu and Srinagar.
- The coordination and process of coordination was shared to the members and requested members to volunteer for strengthening the coordination process at a district level.
- Need was felt to prepare a matrix to collect the primary information from the villages and agencies were requested to share the information from their operational areas with Sphere India for compilation and further dissemination.
- Many organizations has done a preliminary assessment however to get a complete picture Joint Rapid Assessment is highly required.
- Common Logistic planning is required. While Red Cross has volunteered to provide common warehouse. Liasoning with Polytechnic College can be done to provide common warehouse if more capacity is required.
- Members suggested including two ware houses at Jammu while planning the logistic strategy as Jammu is a transit point to transport the relief material for Srinagar too.

### Key Decisions:



- An Orientation on JRNA tools will be organized on Friday, 19<sup>th</sup> September at Red Cross Bhawan, Jammu from 09:30 am onwards. The field assessment will start from Saturday onwards.
- Agencies to share the list of staffs/volunteers to attend the orientation.
- Agencies to update the information on URS matrix (link provided below)
  - URS Matrix (Resource Committed): Jammu and Kashmir Flood 2014
  - URS Matrix (Resource Planning): Jammu and Kashmir Flood 2014
- Agencies to share the information from affected areas with Sphere India for compilation and further dissemination.
- To meet with Govt. official to establish coordination and collaboration with Government.
- To set up a coordination center at Jammu. Red Cross and CEET have volunteered to provide space for coordination center.
- Sphere India to share the logistic planning with Dr. Seth and Mr. Rajiv for further planning at a regional level.
- Mr. RC Puri, Honble Seceretary, Red Cross Jammu volunteer to provide space for Warehouse for Jammu region in Red Cross Sarai building, Jammu.
