



Sitrep -5: Flood in Odisha and Andhra Pradesh 26th October, 2013

A. SITUATION REPORT:

After the Cyclone Phailin and flood, heavy to very heavy rainfall occurred over several parts of Odisha and Andhra Pradesh during last 48 hours under the influence of well marked pressure over South Coastal Andhra Pradesh adjoining West Central Bay of Bengal and neighborhood.

C. GOVERNMENT RESPONSE:

Response in Odisha:

- NDRF rescued 9 people in Hinjilicut of Ganjam district.
- Administration ties up with IAF to move NDRF to different places.
- 3 helicopters deployed for search and rescue operation. 2 at Rangeilunda Airstrip and 1 at Biju Patnaik International Airport.
- MCL deployed pumps sets with manpower for dewatering in Cuttack.
- Fire service personnel and NDRF Battalions deployed at Banpur of Khurda and Kanas of Puri.
- People evacuated are provided with cooked food and dry ration.
- In wake of heavy flood due to rain, the State Govt. has announced all schools and colleges of 12 districts (Gajpati, Ganjam, Kandhmal, Khordha, Puri, Nayagarh Cuttack, Jagtsinghpur, Kendrapara, Bhadrak, Balasore & Mayurbhanj) closed till 28th October, 2013.
- 9 Control room is functioning round the clock with adequate man power, essential commodities and equipments.
- All evacuated people shifted to flood / cyclone shelter and provided with cooked food

Response in Andhra Pradesh:

- District collectors all over the state have been asked to be on high alert and to evacuate people from low lying areas.
- Nine teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations. Four teams were sent to Srikakulam, three to Guntur and one each to Nalgonda and West Godavari district.
- Chief minister N Kiran Kumar Reddy held an emergency meeting in Hyderabad with top officials and cabinet colleagues to take stock of the situation, and directed officials to carry out rescue and relief operations effectively.
- The administration has declared holiday in all the educational institutes.

D. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE:

- Humanitarian agencies are responding with immediate relief materials.



- IAG Andhra Pradesh and Odisha are closely monitoring the situation.
