



Sitrep -4: Severe Cyclonic Storm Phailin and Flood

26th October, 2013

A. SITUATION REPORT:

After the Cyclone Phailin and flood in major rivers of northern parts of Odisha, which were the peripheral effect of the high-velocity cyclone which led to massive inundation in the vast coastal belt of Odisha, the state is again experiencing a heavy flooding due to continues rainfall since 20th October with a repeat of Low Pressure over South Coastal Andhra Pradesh adjoining West Central Bay of Bengal.

C. GOVERNMENT RESPONSE:

- In wake of heavy flood due to rain, the State Govt. has announced all schools and colleges of 12 districts (Gajpati, Ganjam, Kandhmal, Khordha, Puri, Nayagarh Cuttack, Jagtsinghpur, Kendrapara, Bhadrak, Balasore & Mayurbhanj) closed till 28th October, 2013.
- 9 Control room is functioning round the clock with adequate man power, essential commodities and equipments.
- All evacuated people shifted to flood / cyclone shelter and provided with cooked food

Relief Restoration as on 19th October:

- About 7.00 Lakh persons were being provided with cooked food in the relief camps.
- Total Roads affected- Total Roads affected- 8099 Km. Out of which Road length of 8039 Km. has been cleared. All roads up to the Tahasil/ Panhayat Samiti level have been cleared.
- 740 doctors, 3910 paramedical personnel and 3238 medical camps are established in the affected areas.
- Out of 38997 sub station affected, 19053 have been restored.
- Power has been restored in 24789 out of 45960 villages/ towns where power has disrupted,
- 80,000 households have been given temporarily shelter material (Polythene sheets). Steps are being taken to procure more polythene sheets. NDMA has sent a team of psychosocial team.
- 370 MT of cattle feed supplied to affected districts.
- Out of 3028 affected piped water supply schemes, 1120 has been restored, 234 number of water tankers are provided. About 42 Lakh Halogen Tablets and 200 Quintal of Bleaching Powder have been distributed in the affected areas. More than 73.00 Lakh Halogen tablets are available in the district ware houses. As of 19th Oct. 36282 nos. of wells have been disinfected.

D. HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE:

- IAG Odisha has finalized the Rapid Need Assessment with the help of members of IAG and Sphere India.
- IAG Odisha is regularly meeting to discuss and share updates on the current situation.
- IAG Odisha is strategizing for a detail multi sectoral assessment with support from Sphere India based on the experience of Uttarakhand.



- IAG is also working on the deployment of District coordinators in the worst affected areas with support from Sphere India.
- Detail response by the Humanitarian agencies is attached in the URS Matrix excel sheet. And requested others agencies to share their information at the earliest.

E. IMMEDIATE NEEDS:

- Temporary shelter, Drinking water, Food, Nutritional food for babies/ children, Medicines, WASH kits, solar lights & candle, match box, tarpaulin & mat for wet floor.
- Disinfection of all drinking water sources.
- Clearance of solid waste and debris (human excreta, tree and house damage materials etc.)
- Temporary toilet facilities as the people are practicing open defecation.
