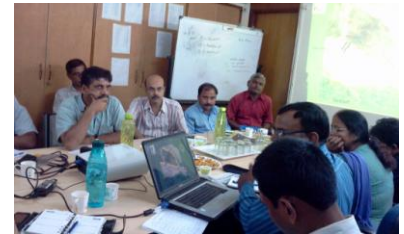


IAGUP EMERGENCY MEETING REPORT

Date: August 3, 2011

The Meeting had been started at 11.30 AM by welcoming to all members and after that IAGUP Coordinator shared the current flood situation of Uttar Pradesh with special focusing on Barabanki and Gonda flood situation due to Elgin Charsadi embankment breach.



At present some of district from central and maximum district of eastern Uttar Pradesh are facing flood situation because regular rains and more than 1.5 lakh cusec water comes from Nepal regularly.

As of now due to breach affected numbers of villages has increased at Barabanki side but Gonda side it remains the same 52 villages.

CARE India representative Jeet Singh suggested that IAGUP know concentrate on breach affected area because this area having massive problems.

Dipti pant (CRS, Lucknow) suggested we pay more attention on this breach affected area but if any critical situation in another area we also take-up as emergency.



Aditi Umrao (UNDP) suggested that it golden hour for IAGUP to start any response process right now. Because if start right now every body recognize IAGUP.

Amaresh Panday (CRS) suggested to IAGUP secretariat for preparing a proper road map of these areas for reach and establishing camp office it self. Also prepare a list of affected Tahasil, Blocks and Villages name with affected populations.

Dr Bhanu suggested that for good start to plan a joint assessment on both district. Maximum member is agreed for this.

Aditi suggested that Govt. machinery should conduct assessment itself so why we spend our energy for doing in another assessment. Government Assessment data shared with IAGUP.

Jeet Singh (CARE India) told as INGO we all have our mended so assessment is the necessity of our and we conduct assessment for gap filling in government process not for duplication.

Members suggested the beneficiary list (program participant list) should be prepared by IAGUP secretariat. Dr. Bhanu replied that it may not be feasible with present capacity of IAG UP hence it should be done by individual agency.

It was suggested that IAGUP should be in regular communication with the administration and behave as a single window for all humanitarian agencies to Govt authorities in the state (similarly as Sphere India being considered at the Centre). Members agreed for this process. (If this is decided, IAG must have an efficient system with human and financial resources to cater to the need of hour, Sphere India's input and support required)

It has been decided that IAG UP shall write a facilitation letter to district administration and all agencies may carry that letter to Govt while making an entry in the field.

Ratnesh is the point person for whole process.

Action Points:

- Quick joint need assessment
- Interaction with Government for avoided duplications
- Coordination and Identifying Gaps
- Resource Mapping and Capacity Assessment of IAGUP members
