Janakiya Pankalithavum Punarnirmanavum Initiative-operationalizing Accountabilities to affected/at-risk populations in Kerala

- Builds on the Kerala model of People's Plans (Janakeeya Aasoothranam) and democratic decentralization to ensure people-led post-disaster recovery process
- JPP-I is institutionalized within Kudumbashree, Self-Help Group network with 4.3 million women members supported by the Local Self Government Department, enabling a connection between ongoing development planning processes and women-led humanitarian response and recovery.
- Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA), State Planning Board and Kerala Institute of Local Administration are the technical partners
- Collaboration with other UN agencies is underway. TISS, Ridhhi Foundation, EID,
 Sphere India and CDAC provide strategic technical and implementation support.


Accountability to Affected population in Kerala

Feed back on the action taken to the affected/atrisk communities

Needs and Feed back of the communities collected

Sharing life-saving critical information and empowering communities to provide feedback on DRR/EPR services

Coordination within DM & sectoral departments established to share collected feedback of affected people at State, District and GP level



Integration of feedback in the Local Self Govt Plans, & Sectoral Plans at State & District level including Disaster Management Plans for recovery

5 stage process

JPP-I: Kerala Expected Results

- 1% affected people (i.e 19,869 of 5.5. million) engaged monthly for feedback and people-led rehabilitation, reconstruction and recovery planning
- Feedback Platform available for information at GP, District and State level (Revenue and Relief, Kudumbashree, LSG and Sectoral Secretaries)

By 2019-2020: 489 Gram Panchayat Plans, 7 DDMPs, 1 SDMP and 7-9 sectoral plans are AAP and Risk Informed






Significant Migrant workers, Agricultural Laborers, Cultivators, Children, Fisher-Folk and Elderly people have not been able to access relief assistance.

From whom assistance was received in first 30 days






Predominantly, assistance was received from government followed by NGOs.

Are you aware of any complaint/grievance redressal mechanism?



Knowledge of complaint and redressal mechanisms was overall low and was less than 20% in Thrissur and Idukki. Among Marginalized Groups, Women Entrepreneurs (linked to Kudumbashree) and Fisher-Folk were more informed about redressal mechanisms.

Satisfaction with post-flood relief and rehabilitation efforts in your village/ward



Fisher-folk and Women micro-entrepreneurs were satisfied with post flood assistance and rehabilitation efforts. SC/ST were found to be significantly dissatisfied with post flood support. Women HHs, Cultivators and Elderly had limited knowledge of flood relief efforts.

Facts about Kerala Floods and Landslides

1.45 million people were in relief camps and 5.5 million people in 11 out of 14 districts are affected; PDNA by GoK and UN estimate damage and loss at INR 32,000 Crores (approx. USD 4.7 Billion) for rehabilitation, reconstruction and recovery.










Housing: Support needed to rebuild, repair or retrofit homes




Repairing of homes was a priority for all marginalized groups. KSDMA with RKI is rolling out housing initiative which includes rebuilding support, Inclusive housing for disabled, elderly and other vulnerable groups and communication on resilient repairing and retrofitting of homes.

Housing: Received any housing reconstruction or repair support from any source




All marginalized groups need support for housing reconstruction and repairing.

WASH: Reconstruction priorities besides building homes




Water supply followed by roads are the reconstruction priorities besides building homes

Access to health services were improved after the floods. Yet for Migrant Labourers, cultivators, girls and women entrepreneurs seems to think otherwise.

Children and Education: Main problems experienced by children of the household after floods




Most of the children could not go to school across 7 districts.




14.23% children from seven districts reported dropping out of schools after floods.



Livelihoods: Affected people who lost their job



Wayanad and Alappuzha affected with people loosing their jobs after floods. Fisher folk, Agricultural Labourers and women entrepreneur were significantly affected.

Janakiya Pankalithavum Punarnirmanavum Initiative-Next Steps

- Work with State Planning Board in institutionalizing use of voices of affected people, marginalized groups and opinions LSG elected officials to inform GPDP plan finalizations, DRR Plans at state and district level.s
- Support government in monitoring extent of access and outreach of government schemes and recovery programmes, with a special focus on at-risk population
- Establish circular feedback loops with Panchayat and basis to make the recovery process robust at all levels
