There is an urgent need for a whole-of-society approach towards prevention and risk-informed recovery and development. Good governance and responsive government institutions are the cornerstone of effective disaster management and risk reduction. Thus, the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM) and Sphere India are organising a Workshop to commemorate International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction (IDDRR Day) 2021 and a Media Roundtable focussing on the role of media in disaster risk reduction on 13 Oct 2021.
