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Indian Delegation at APMCDRR 2022 Holds Discussion with Union Minister

Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference for Disaster Risk Reduction (APMCDRR) is an intergovernmental meeting organised in support of UNISDR to assess the progress made by nation states and related agencies in disaster risk management in different priority areas/sectors. This year the APMCDRR Conference was held in Brisbane (Australia) from 19th-22nd September 2022. The Indian Delegation at Asia Pacific Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction 2022 (APMCDRR) had a meeting with Shri Nityanand Rai, Honorable Minister of State for Home Affairs, Government of India, on the sidelines of the multilateral event, and discussions were held on accelerating progress on disaster risk reduction, improving coordination and cooperation, challenges, and way forward. Members of India delegation at APMCDRR-2022 in Brisbane, Australia also came together to discuss the learning and way forward from the conference, outlining various milestones and roadmap for "From Crisis to Resilience: Brisbane to India"

Training Program on the Multi-sector Coordination for Response & Resilience in TN

A three-day training program on the Multi-sector Coordination for Response & Resilience was conducted in Tamil Nadu from 14th-16th September 2022. Organised jointly by NIDM & Sphere India, the training aimed at enhancing the capacities and knowledge of stakeholders for emergency preparedness and response. It was continuation of the 6 Multi-Sector organised in Coordination Handbooks on Emergency Preparedness and Response launched in 2021 by the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM) and Sphere India.

Sitreps, Alerts in response to Floods and other Emergencies in the Country

In response to floods in various parts of India, Situation Reports (SitReps) were prepared and disseminated for the use of various stakeholders working for the response & relief of affected communities and at risk populations. In addition to this, daily and weekly alerts were issued after observing IMD, CWC, and INCOISE websites, every monday morning.



Webinar on Pilot Testing of Training Manual on Cash and Voucher Assistance in Disasters

A webinar was conducted on pilot testing of a training manual on cash and voucher assistance in disasters in Assam and Tamil Nadu. The training manual on cash and voucher assistance aims to enhance the capacities of humanitarian agencies and professionals responding to disasters on issues associated with cash transfer programs and build the knowledge and capacities of emergency managers who will be responsible for running cash transfer programs. The training program was organized by Sphere India in collaboration with NIDM and state IAGs.

NCDHR Releases Study on Impact of Droughts on Dalits and Adivasis of Marathwada National Campaign on Dalit Human Rights (NCDHR) released the study "Drought, Dalits and Adivasis: Impact of Droughts catalyzed by Climate Change on Dalits and Adivasis of Marathwada, Maharashtra" in Aurangabad, Maharashtra, on September 16. The study reflects how the Dalits and Adivasis in general and women, children, aged and PwDs, in particular, are adopting precarious coping strategies to

droughts in the Marathwada region of Maharashtra. It captures their tryst with recurring droughts and caste /social, origin/ descent-induced pre-existing vulnerabilities. The recommends study making drought proofing management; state climate action plans, and disaster management from local to higher governance levels inclusive of the voices and concerns of the most marginalized sections.



The National Disaster Management Authority, headed by the Prime Minister, was established following the passage of the Disaster Management Act by the Central Government on December 23, 2005. The authority envisions building a safer and disaster-resilient India by implementing a holistic, proactive, technology-driven, and sustainable development strategy that involves all stakeholders and fosters a culture of prevention, preparedness, and mitigation.

Updates from International Humanitarian Community

APMCDRR 2022 Concludes with the Brisbane Declaration The Brisbane Declaration officially brought down the curtain on the APMCDRR 2022. The 2022 Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction presented an opportunity for delegates from across the Asia Pacific to showcase and share experiences, actions, and innovations to help build a resilient future for the region. The conference also represented a final opportunity ahead for the Mid-Term Review of the SFDRR (2015-2030) in 2023, to focus on Sendai Framework progress and commitments in the Asia-Pacific Region.

Multi-hazard early warning system custom indicators & methodologies for computation: The purpose of this document is to support countries in the computation of custom indicators developed to measure the effectiveness of Multi-Hazard Early Warning Systems (MHEWS), available via the Sendai Framework Monitor national level reporting. The objective of the methodology outlined is to allow for consistent measurement of progress towards a minimum standard of an effective MHEWS when using the custom indicators. A downloadable computation worksheet is also available to assist in computing non-binary calculations. Read More>>



UNDP's Gender Equality Strategy 2022-2025: Aligned with its Strategic Plan, Gender Equality Strategy 2022-2025 guides UNDP in efforts to assist countries in accelerating progress on gender equality and empowerment of women over the next four years. It aims to move beyond piecemeal efforts and to instead help countries to shift power structures and the economic, social, and political systems that perpetuate discrimination. The strategy is grounded in UNDP's commitment to eradicating poverty, reducing inequalities and exclusion, and supporting the empowerment of all women. Read More>>



United in Science: It provides an overview of the most recent science related to climate change, impacts, and responses from the World Meteorological Organization and partner organizations such as the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction, UNEP, Met Office, Global Carbon Project, and IPCC. At a time when urgent action to address climate change is needed, the report provides unified scientific information to inform decision-makers and highlights some of the physical and socioeconomic impacts of the current and projected climate change. Human Development Report: In the wake of the pandemic, and for the first time ever, the global Human Development Index (HDI) value declined for two years straight. Many countries experienced ongoing declines in the HDI in 2021. Even before the pandemic, feelings of insecurity were on the rise nearly everywhere. Many people feel alienated from their political systems, and in another reversal, democratic backsliding has worsened. There is peril in new uncertainties, in the insecurity, polarization and demagoguery that grip countries. Read More>>



Air Pollution in Asia and the Pacific: Science-based Solutions: This report identifies 25 clean air measures that can positively impact human health, crop yields, climate change and socio-economic development, as well as contribute to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals. Implementing these measures could help 1 billion people breathe cleaner air by 2030 and reduce global warming by a third of a degree Celsius by 2050. The top 25 measures not only represent wins for cities and countries looking to improve air quality but also provide next-generation business opportunities and boost economic growth. Read More>>

The GP2022 took stock of Sendai Framework implementation, recommended actions for policy makers, highlighted good practices and raised awareness.
