SITUATION UPDATE

- Heavy rains, accompanied by a hailstorm, lashed several parts of Manipur on Sunday, May 5, around 1400 hours, causing significant damage to houses and vehicles.
- Parts of Bishnupur, Imphal West, Imphal East, Thoubal, Kakching, Tengnoupal, kangpokpi, Noney and Churachandpur districts were affected by the adverse weather conditions
- Several houses sustained damage in different parts of the state, including Canchipur and Tera in Imphal West. The hailstorm left holes on tin roofs, exacerbating the destruction.
- Strong winds accompanying the storm blew away hutments in various areas, adding to the extent of the damage.
- The hailstorm caused cracks in the windshields of four-wheelers parked in the open, further impacting residents.
- Additionally, trees were uprooted in many areas due to the strong winds.
- The Imphal International Airport also sustained damage due to the hailstorm
- The electricity supply was disrupted in the affected areas, compounding the challenges faced by residents.
- Traffic flow was disrupted as debris littered the roads, impeding movement and requiring clearance efforts.

- Additionally, the Chief Minister has instructed all district officials to promptly submit reports detailing the extent of damages incurred due to the adverse weather conditions.
- The Meteorological Department has issued an orange alert for heavy to very heavy rains in several Northeastern states, including Manipur, until Tuesday, May 7.
- Sphere India in coordination with IAG Manipur is closely monitoring the situation.
