
## **Situation Report 1**

# Karnataka Rainfall

# Date: 21<sup>st</sup> May 2025 Time: 10.00 AM (IST)

### SITUATION UPDATE

- Karnataka continues to reel under intense pre-monsoon rainfall, causing widespread disruptions across multiple districts. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued red alerts for four districts, forecasting extremely heavy rainfall accompanied by thunderstorms and gusty winds. <u>Read More>></u>
- The state has reported five fatalities due to rain-related incidents, including three deaths in Bengaluru alone. Bengaluru experienced significant waterlogging after receiving 130 mm of rain over a 12-hour period from Sunday evening to early Monday, leading to widespread flooding and traffic disruptions.
- Flooded streets turned into streams, submerging or sweeping away 44 fourwheelers and 93 two-wheelers. Additionally, 27 trees were uprooted, and branches fell from 43 others. According to the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) report dated 20/06/2025, two houses were fully damaged and eight houses partially damaged. For More

Houses inundated : Approx. 500

- Approximately 500 homes have been flooded, and over 20 lakes are nearing overflow conditions, worsening the situation.
- The Hennur-Bagalur Road, an alternate route to Kempegowda International Airport, was flooded, causing difficulties for motorists and traffic police. Civic authorities remain on high alert and have implemented emergency measures to manage the ongoing crisis.
- Flooding extended to areas like Kengeri and RR Nagar, where 100 homes were inundated and five animals perished.

#### **Government Response**

- Deputy Chief Minister reported that flooding issues have been resolved in 70% of the identified flood-prone areas in Bengaluru. He stated that proactive measures, including the construction of 197 kilometers of stormwater drains, have been implemented to mitigate flooding risks. The government has identified 210 floodprone areas, with 166 areas addressed, 24 under ongoing work, and plans to begin work in the remaining 20 areas soon
- The government continues to monitor the situation closely and is committed to resolving the remaining issues promptly. Residents are urged to stay informed through official channels and adhere to safety advisories issued by local authorities
- In response to the ongoing crisis, the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) has deployed 04 teams across the state to assist in rescue and relief operations.
